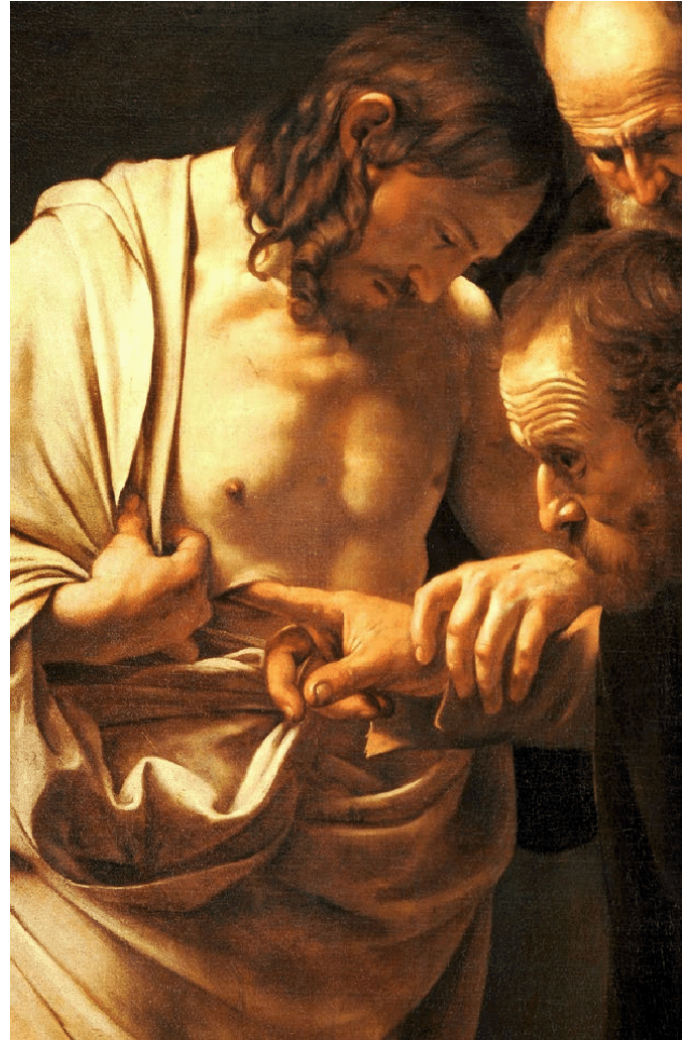

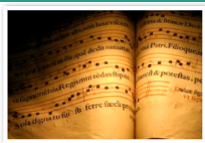

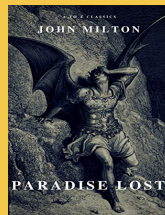

A PARISHIONER ASKS ...

I noticed that what happened here on Good Friday was called a *service*. What's the difference between a service and a Mass? I thought those terms were interchangeable.

Good Friday's service couldn't be called a Mass because there was no consecration. Fr. Charles, in persona Christi, did not consecrate the Body and Blood of Jesus at the altar. The Hosts distributed at Communion at the Good Friday service had been consecrated the night before at Holy Thursday Mass.

The Roman Catholic Mass *must* include a priest's consecration for it to be called a Mass.

St. Thomas Aquinas describes the heart of what the Mass is all about: the re-presentation of Christ's offering of Himself to the Heavenly Father. And then this gift of Christ to the Father pours forth to the Church in the reception of Holy Eucharist.

Catholics who attend Mass have asked for forgiveness of their sins, listened to the Word of God, reflected upon its impact on their lives through the homily, entered into the redemptive work of Jesus, and received Him in the Eucharist. Calling this miracle a *service* doesn't do it justice.

During the Easter season, the universal Church prays the prayer *Regina Caeli*, or *Queen of Heaven*, to joyfully unite with the Mother of God in celebrating the Resurrection of her Son Jesus Christ, who conquered death in this way.

The recitation of the antiphon of *Regina Caeli* was established by Pope Benedict XIV in 1742 and replaced, during the Easter season - from the celebration of the Resurrection until Pentecost Sunday - the recitation of the *Angelus*, whose meditation focuses on the mystery of the Incarnation.

Like the *Angelus*, the *Regina Caeli* is prayed three times a day, at dawn, noon, and sunset, to consecrate the day to God and the Virgin Mary.

The author of this liturgical composition, which dates back to the twelfth century, is unknown, but it is known that the Franciscan friars repeated it after Compline (Liturgy of the Hours) in the first half of the following century. Later, it was popularized and spread throughout the Christian world.

Queen of Heaven

V. Queen of Heaven, rejoice, alleluia.
R. For He whom you did merit to bear, alleluia.
V. Has risen, as he said, alleluia.
R. Pray for us to God, alleluia.
V. Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary, alleluia.
R. For the Lord has truly risen, alleluia.

Let us pray. O God, who gave joy to the world through the resurrection of Thy Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, grant we beseech Thee that through the intercession of the Virgin Mary, His Mother, we may obtain the joys of everlasting life. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
